





Photography guides her practice, which draws on reference images of fleeting moments and popular aesthetic trends that she translates to canvas.





















Initial connections are always established through drawing outside of the studio. A way of engaging with place and recording experience, these drawings have an immediacy and freedom which dictate the development of work back in the studio. The movement between materials and making techniques is central to Gardner's studio practice. Paintings and sculptures develop simultaneously as connections are constructed between surface and form. Mark-making, energy and colour are at the forefront of his making process as he explores the physicality and nuances of the material.



Gently referencing Australian architecture, Naoise Halloran-Mackay's sculptures suggest transition and possibility. His 'doorways' can be understood as transition points or thresholds between humankind and nature, interiority and exteriority. Halloran-Mackay's visual vocabulary is at once both familiar and distant. Grounded in known architectural forms, his paintings allude to the intersection of theology, mythology and imagination. Since graduating from BFA (Painting) in 2018, Halloran-Mackay has exhibited in a range of artist run initiatives and curatorial spaces.



Julian Martin is an established artist known for his pastel works, which are characterised by their rich surfaces and distinctive visual statements. Martin is methodical in his approach, often working from photographs and arranged still life, deconstructing these references to create abstract compositions. His work embodies a continuous reinterpretation of form, using colour, shape, and tone to evoke a strong bodily resonance. Martin's latest series marks a pivotal evolution in his practice, highlighting a more unrestrained and experimental application of materials.

Stefan Wirihana Mau is an artist of Māori (Ngāpuhi) and Eastern European descent. Born in Frankston, Mau lives and works on BoonWurrung and Wurundjeri Country. His practice spans across painting, printmaking and sculpture, exploring cultural concepts as he seeks to connect with his Māori heritage. Growing up away from his ancestral lands in Aotearoa (NZ) and having limited access to cultural practice, Mau's work draws from his growing understanding of mātauranga Māori (Māori knowledge) which he has begun weaving into his art practice as he learns. Mau's work has recently been exhibited at NGV as part of Melbourne Now (2023), he has also been a finalist in the Arthur Guy Memorial Painting Prize at Bendigo Art Gallery, the Doug Moran Portrait Prize (2022) and the Experimental Print Prize (2021) at Castlemaine Art Museum.
